my sins, and is able to save to the utmost all that come unto  
God by him. Seeing he <sup>w<sup>t</sup>th to make Intercession for them and  
who I trust will not reject me a sorrowing penitent sinner,  
when I com<sup>e</sup> to him for mercy. In this hope and confidence  
I render up my soul with comfort humbly beseeching the most blessed  
and glorious Trinity, one god most holy, merciful and gracious to  
prepare me for the time of my dissolution and to take me to himself  
into that peace and rest and incomparable felicity which he has  
prepared for those that love and fear his holy name. ever blessed  
be god. Impurely I give my body to the earth from whence it was  
taken in full assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last  
day as for my burial, I desire it may be decent without pomp  
or state at the discretion of my dear wife and my executors here  
after named, who I doubt not will manage it with all requisite  
prudence. As to my worldly estate, I will and positively order  
that all my just debts be paid</sup>

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Goode all my  
tract of land lying in the state of Kentucky upon Green River  
containing five hundred acres be the same more or less which  
land I give to him and his heirs forever.

Item I have left unto my daughter Susana Osborne two negroes  
Fancy and Delsy which negroes my wife and I do now own that  
she kept for during the natural life of my wife Sally Goode  
Item I have left unto my daughter Polly Brown two negroes  
Delsy and Sally also I have left unto my daughter Lucy  
two negroes Effy and Daniel all of which negroes were

And desire is that they keep for during the natural life  
of my wife Sally Goode Item My will and desire is that the  
whole of my estate that I have now in possession, remain together  
as I now is, for the use of my wife and family for during  
the natural life of my wife Sally Goode with this proviso that  
if any of my children that are now living with me unmarried  
(to wit Sarah, Frances Anne, Elizabeth G, Joseph or Thomas Goode)  
should marry, my will and desire is, that my executors  
hereafter named, do lend unto them or any of them, that  
should marry for during the life of my wife, such part of my  
estate as shall be near equal to what I have before lent to my  
daughters that have married. Item I give and bequeath to my  
son John B Goode seventy pounds current money of Virginia  
to be paid to him out of my estate after the death of my wife  
Sally Goode which sum I give to him and his heirs forever.  
Item I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Goode Twenty  
pounds current money of Virginia to be paid to him out of  
my estate after the decease of my wife, which sum I give  
to him and his heirs forever Also I give and bequeath  
to my son William Goode One hundred and forty pounds in  
money of Virginia to be paid to him out of my estate after  
the death of my wife which sum I give to him and his heirs forever  
In my testative will and desire is that the

my wife ~~to~~ John Brown give to him and his heirs, my  
very Mrs, positive will and desire is that after the death  
of my wife, by Goodes that the whole of my negroes together with  
those that are or may be left to any of my children (except  
all that shall be born of any of my negroes after this date) with  
eighty pounds cash from my Daughter Polly Brown and forty  
pounds from my Daughter Susana Osborn be deposited  
into one general Stock, all of which negroes (to wit Custer, Phil,  
Grace, Job, Sincho, Ephraim, Bird, Kil, Iham, Nat, Haman,  
Jack, Patrick, Nathan, Martin, Judy, Nancy, Delsey, Baby and  
old Delsey Effy and Daniel) and sums of money I give to  
be equally divide between my sons and daughters Susanna  
Osborn, Polly Brown, Lucy Hatter, Sarah, Frances, Anne, Elizabeth  
Joseph and Thomas Goode, all of which I give to them and  
their heirs forever. Also after the decease of my wife my  
will and desire is, that the whole of my estate both real and  
movable (~~not before given or excepted~~) be sold at the discretion  
of executors hereafter named, and the money arising from  
such sale after paying to John C, Samuel and William Goode  
the several sums I have before given them, I give to be equally  
divided between my son and daughter Susana Osborn  
Polly Brown, Lucy Hatter, Sarah, Frances Anne Elizabeth

Legacy, pounds cash from my Daughter Polly Brown and forty  
pounds do from my Daughter Susana Osborne be deposited  
into the general Stock, all of which negroes (to wit Cootie, Pho-  
nace, Abi, Inch, Ephraim, Bird, Kid, Isham, Nat, Haman,  
Jack Patrick, Nathan, Martin, Judy, Nancy, Delsy, Baby and  
Old Delsy Effy and Daniel) and sums of money I give to  
be equally divided between my sons and daughters Susanna  
Osborne, Polly Brown, Lucy Hatter, Sarah Frances, Anne, Elizabeth  
Joseph and Thomas Goode, all of which I give to them and  
their heirs forever. Also after the decease of my wife my  
will and desire is, that the whole of my estate both real and  
moveable (not before given or excepted) be sold at the discretion  
of my executors hereafter named, and the money arising from  
such sale after paying to John C, Samuel and William Goode  
several sums I have before given them, I give to be equally  
divided between my son and daughter Susanna Osborne  
Polly Brown, Lucy Hatter, Sarah Frances Anne Elizabeth  
Joseph and Thomas Goode, which legacy I give  
to them and their heirs forever. Also my posterity will in  
whatever number the widow negro shall may or shall be

born of any of my negroes after this date be born free, tho to be held in servitude by those legatees to whom they may fall till they arrive to the age of twenty five years, provided those legatees to whom they fall teach them to read and write, and in case any should refuse to educate them as much as that, my will is they be free at the age of twenty one years, and I do hereby constitute my sons Joseph and William Goode Executors with my wife Sally Goode Executrix of this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and four.

their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond for that purpose  
in the sum of six thousand pounds and conditioned according to Law  
and took the oath required by Law certificate for obtaining a probat there  
in due form is granted them
