But of a sound mind and Memory thanks be to God for the same
and calling to Mind the uncertainty of Life do Recommend my
most precious Soul to the almighty, trusting in the merits of
a Redeeming Saviour and after directing my Body to be decently
Interred unto my just Debt's paid. I dispose of my Estate in the
manner following.

First I give unto my two Sons John and William the tract of Land
whereon I now live to be Equally divided between them, to them and
their heirs forever. —

I give to my Daughter Nancy my Negro Girl Lively, to her and
her heirs forever it is my will and desire that there shall be sold
of my Stock of Cattle and Horses sufficient to Raise a sum of
money to purchase a Negro of Equal Value with Lively which I give
unto my Daughter Jean the Residue of my Stock and Household
and Kitchen furniture to be Equally divided between my two
Daughters Nancy and Jean to them and their heirs forever. —

I give unto my Son John Armstrong my Negro George to him and
his heirs forever. I give unto my Daughter Mary Armstrong twenty
Shillings. I give unto my Daughter Annis Hays twenty Shillings,
and lastly I constitute and appoint my two Sons John and
William Armstrong Sole Executors of this my last will and Tes-
tament hereby Revoking all others by me heretofore made in testimony
whereof I have heretunto set my hand and affixed my Seal
this 1st day of November in the year of our Lord 1798.
