do hereby publicly being of perfect mind and memory, thanks to
God for the same, calling to mind the mortality of my body and
knowing that all men must die, do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of
all I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my body I
recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like
manner, at the discretion of my executors, and touching
such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bestow on me
in this life I give and dispose of in the following manner
and form,

Imprimis it is my Will and I do order in the full power
of my just will and funeral Charges be paid, I then
give and bequeath unto my Brother John Caldwell all that
I am possessed with, whether Bills Bonds, accounts or any
thing else pertaining to me in anywise, and I do hereby
utterly revoke and disannul all former Wills or Legacies
heretofore by me made, and confirm this to be my last
Will and Testament, and do constitute and appoint my
Brother John Caldwell my only and sole Executor, of this
my last Will and Testament; In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year
above written
