In the Name of God Amen, I the to only free man of July 1782 Thomas Harris of Prince Edward County Va. being Weak of Body but of Sound mind Memory and Understanding, do make, constitute and declare this my last Will and Testament in a Manner and form following, that is to say first I will and order that all my just Debts and funeral Expenses be discharged and paid off as soon as conveniently may be after my Decease by my Executors hereafter named My Wife and bequeath to my Love and well beloved wife Elizabeth the Plantation whereon I now dwell containing One hundred and

my power with the things I do; household furniture and the
contents of my study, to her and her heirs & assigns & no more.
I will give over of any of my estate be left for my Wife Elizabeth
Desires to be equally divided amongst my Children (to wit) David
John Peter Elizabeth and Frederick to them and their heirs
for ever & no more.

I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my Wife Elizabeth
David Harris Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness
whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of
June 1784, and so witnessed by the said David Harris to be his last Will
and Testament in presence of us.
