children; Also it is my desire that any part of my stock and household furniture shall be sold if my  
Executor and Excoator shall think it necessary for the payment of my debts. Lastly I do  
hereby appoint my wife Sarah Holley my executors Granck Green and Anna Hartman Executors of  
this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this fifteenth day of August, one  
Hundred seven hundred and ninety five.

In the year of God A.M.C. the fourteenth day of April 1795. I Stephen East of Town  
Edward County being sick and unable to speak clear and distinctly, and knowing it is appointed for all men  
and women to do so make this my Last Will and Testament, as touching any worldly Goods I do posse of them  
in the following manner Attest. In witness I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth, during her natural life 50  
Acres of land beginning at Pidgeons due on the main Road from thence to the mouth of the Spring branch  
River for quantity taking in the houses and orchard, also I give to her for the above Term all the goods money  
together with my stock of Horses, Cattle and Hogs also all my household and kitchen furniture of my self & Father  
John here after named,

Also I give and bequeath to my son Stephen Near 10 Acres of land lying on the south side South  
branch, there up a branch between John South's land and mine, thence to my back door, thence for security  
to the south fork said South branch thence down said branch as it runs unto the beginning.
