my corn wheat &c also my present crop that is now on the ground with a
quantity of Walnut plank and all bonds debts and accounts that is
now due and will hereafter become due together with every other species
of household stuff that I now possess and have not before mentioned.

to be my last Will and Testament whereunto I have this fourteenth
day of June one thousand eight hundred and three set my hand
