money which he may be owing me, together with all the Estate to
which I may be entitled to at the death of my Mother, and all the Estate
which I may have at my death. Lastly I constitute and appoint my
Brother James Williams Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoking all Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 14th day of April One
Thousand Eight hundred Six.
