I give and devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Wilson three Negroes Melly, Liddy & Sucky and their Increase.
I give and devise to my son Nathaniel Hudson three Negroes Rachel, Plaster and their Increase Hugg.
I give and devise to my son John Hudson all the land in the Tract whereon I now live and
three Negroes Jane, Ann & Lucy and their Increase and Sam.

All the rest of my Negroes and the Stock of all kinds household and Kitchen furniture, in
short all my Moveable Estate I give and devise to be equally divided between my five
Children above mentioned.

I give and devise to each of my Children the several Legacies mentioned heretofore to the
true Intent and meaning thereof. To them and each of them and their Heirs forever.
I do appoint my two sons Nathaniel and John my Executors to this my last Will
and Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
seal this thirty first day of January one Thousand Seven hundred and Ninety five
