

In the Name of God Amen. I William Swelling of the County of Prince Edward being at this time of perfect sense and of sound Mind and Calling to mind the mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all Men Once to Die do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament. —

Impremis. My Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid out of my Estate and the Remainder of my Estate I leave as followeth. —

Item. I bequeath unto my loving Wife Hannah Swelling during her Natural Life or Widowhood the Land & Plantation whereon I now live together with all my Stock of Horses, Cattle & Hogs with all my household furniture of every kind and my will & desire is if my said Wife should at any time of her widowhood be desirous to move that my Executor hereafter mentioned sell the said Land whereon I now live & the money arising from the sale be laid out in another piece of Land for my said Wife ^{as long as she remains} a Widow & At her death or Marriage my Will & desire is that the Land may not be sold but Equally divided between my Two

Sons Noah & Aaron Swelling and if my said wife should
Remain a Widow my Will and desire is that she have full power
to dispose of any part of my Estate for the Benefit of Raising my
said two Sons & at her death or marriage my Will & desire is
that Everything belonging to my Estate with the Land be equally
divided between my two Sons Noah & Aaron Swelling to them
& their Heirs forever & if either of my Sons should die my Will
& desire is that the Surviving son may possess the whole of my
Estate at my Wifes death or Marriage & I do ~~desire~~ ^{desire} that there
be no Appraisement on my Estate & I do ~~appoint~~ ^{appoint} my wife Hannah
Swelling, Executrix of this my last Will and Testament & Revoking
all other Wills & Gifts by me heretofore made I declare this to be my last
