give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form
In premis I give unto Esther my beloved wife all my stock of every kind
together with my household goods and furniture and other moveable
Effects also the land and plantation whereon I now live to be by her peaceably
enjoyed and traffed her natural life and at her decease to be equally divided
amongst all my children to them and their heirs forever but if either of them
should die without issue her lawfully begotten that then the effects to
return and be equally divided amongst the survivors

I give to my son in law James Meekel, one half of the tract of
land I purchased of Bradock Moixy wherein James Meekel now lives
to him and his heirs forever beginning at the mouth of a branch running
into the river at Pains ford and I do constitute and appoint my wife
Esther Peck and James Meekel my sole executors of this my last will
and Testament ratifying this and no other to be my last will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
