of our Lord 1726, one Thousand seven hundred and twenty six, Between Daniel Stur-
divant Son of Prince George County and Bristol Parish of the one part, and John
Lanthrop of the same County and Parish of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
Daniel Sturdivant for and in Consideration of Two Shillings of Lawfull Money of
England to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery hereof, the receipt whereof
he the said Daniel Sturdivant doth hereby acknowledge, and thereof and of every part
thereof doth acquit and discharge the said John Lanthrop, his Executors & Administra-
tors by these presents, Have granted, Bargained and sold, and by these presents doth
grant, Bargain and Sell unto the said John Lanthrop, his Executors and Assigns
part of the Land he the said Daniel Sturdivant bought of Nathl Hudson, Situate
lying and being on the South Side of the Second Swamp, in the County and Parish
aforesaid, and is bounded by the Agreement of the abovesaid parties. Viz: Beginning at
a Mark standing at the head of the old Dividing Line, which divided the
Land of Mathew Mayes and the Land of Isaac Hall, thence along the said
Dividing Line to the Main watercourse of the Second Swamp, thence up the said
Swamp to Daniel Sturdivant's Line, thence along the said Line to a Corner

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
