Daniel Sturdivant for and in Consideration of Five Shillings of Lawfull money of
England to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery hereof, her receipt whereof
he the said Daniel Sturdivant doth hereby acknowledge and thereof and of every part
hereof doth acquit and discharge the said John Lanthrop, his Executors & Administrato-
tors by these presents, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth
grant, Bargain and sell unto the said John Lanthrop his Heirs and Assigns
part of the Land he the said Daniel Sturdivant bought of Nathaniel Hickey
lying and being on the South Side of the Second Swamp in the County and Parish
aforesaid, and is bounded by the Agreement of the above said parties. The Beginning of
a mark Hickey standing at the Head of the old dividing Line, which divided the
Land of Nathaniel Hickey and the Land of James Hall, thence along the said
Dividing Line to the main watercourse of the Second Swamp, thence up the said
Swamp to Daniel Sturdivant Line, thence along the said line to a Corner
