In the Name of God, Amen. I David Crawley of Prince George's County, being weak of Body, but of perfect senses, memory and understanding, and considering the uncertainty of this Transitory Life, do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. —
I Imprecise I bequeath my Soul into the hand of Almighty God, that gave it me, hoping for Salvation through the Merits of my Dear Saviour, Jesus Christ, and my Body to the Earth to be Decently Buried according to the Discretion of my Executors hereinafter named, and as for what Worldly Goods it hath pleased Almighty God to Endow me withall, I give and bequeath as followeth, after all my Worldly Debts and Funerall Expenses are paid and discharged. —

Item. I Leave and bequeath unto my Wife Sarah Crawley during her Widowhood, and no longer, then to Descend as followeth. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son, George Crawley, Two Hundred and forty Acres of Land, lying on the North Side of Meherrin River, bounded according to Patent Dated the Eighteenth Day of February, One Thousand, Seven hundred, Twenty two, and all my Stock Hogg and Cattle that is thereon, to him his heirs and assigns for ever. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son William Crawley Three Hundred and Twenty Acres of Land, lying in the Province of North Carolina, on the North Side of Roanoke River, and also my Entry of Land in Brunswick County, on Cedar Creek, to him and his heirs and assigns for ever. —

Item. I Will and bequeath unto Nathaniel Garrison Esq^r all my

and forty Acres of Land, lying on the North Side of Meherrin River,
bounded according to Patent Dated the Eighteenth Day of February, One
Thousand, Seven hundred, twenty two, and all my Stock Hogs and Cattle
that is thereon to him his heirs and assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Crawley Three Hundred
and Twenty Acres of Land lying in the Province of North Carolina, on the
North side of Roanoke River, and also my Entry of Land in Brunswick
County on Cedar Creek to him and his heirs and assigns for ever.

Item I will and bequeath unto Nathaniel Harrison Esq^r all my
Land, Plantation and Stock Hogs & Cattle thereon, lying and being on
the North and South Side of Meherrin River, joining on the Land of
John Wall and Henry Wyck, for and towards the payment of my Debt

to him the said Nathaniel Harrison Esq^r his heirs and assigns for ever.

Item And if the said Nathaniel Harrison is not therewith Content
for the payment of the said Debt, I will and bequeath as much of my
Hogs and Cattle that is at Roanoke, as he shall think fitt therewith to
be satisfied the said Debt to him and his heirs and assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son David Crawley all the rest of
my Land to him and his heirs for ever, and also my Indian servants with
their families and their children and my Indian property being my Negroes
and my Indian servants to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Crawley my Indian
servants to him and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son David Crawley all my Slaves and Cattle belonging to the plantation whereon I now Live.

Item. I Will and bequeath all the rest of my personal Estate to be equally divided between my Loving Wife Tabitha Crawley, George Crawley, William Crawley and David Crawley my sons.

Item. I do appoint my son David Crawley my whole and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 29th of March, 1725.

At a Court held at Fitzgerralds, for the County of Prince George, on the second Tuesday in September, being the thirtieth Day of the said month, Anno Domini 1726.

The above written Last Will and Testament of David Crawley deceased was presented into Court by Tabitha Crawley his Widow, and the Executor named in the said Will, being an Infant, the said Tabitha made Oath thereof, and it being proved by the Oaths of William Crawley and James Sturdivant, two of the Witnesses thereto, by Order of the Court is truly Recorded and on the motion of the said Tabitha Crawley, and her giving Bond and Security according to Law, Certificate is granted her for obtaining a Commission of Administration with the said Will annexed in due form.
