I Thomas Taylor, of the Parrish of Southwark, in the County of Surry, Master,
Send Greeting, in our Lord God Everlasting, KNOW Yell That I the sd. Thomas
Taylor, for and in Consideration of the Naturall Love, and Affection, which I
have, and do beare unto my Daughter Elizabeth, the Wife of John Chambers
of the County of Prince George, Have given and granted, and by this my present
Writing, Does give and grant, unto the said Elizabeth, and the Heirs of her Body
begotten, One Negro Girl, called Judy, and her Increase. To Have and Com-
bold the said Negro Judy, and her Increase, unto the said Elizabeth, and the
Heirs of her Body begotten, and to and for no other Use, or purpose what so-
ever. In Witness whereof the said Thomas Taylor, hath hereunto set
his hand and Affixed his Seal this fourteenth Day of May, in the Year of Our
Lord Christ, One thousand seven hundred, twenty Eight.
