

Wyatt Ed.
his Will

In the Name of God Amen I Edward Wyatt Sen^r of the Parish of
Martin Brandon in the County of Prince Georges, being very Sick and weak in Body,
but of perfect mind and memory, thank be given unto God, therefore calling unto
mind the Mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to dye, Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testaments, that is to say
principally and first of all I give and recommend my soule unto the hand of
God that gave it, and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in
a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors,
Nothing Doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God. And as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life, I give, devise and Dispose of the
same in the manner and form following, to wit: Prince of Georges Co. Wills 1713-1728
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I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Wyatt, and the heirs of hers
lawfully begotten, three Negro Girls one named Moll Jenny, Patsy, and Hannah, and
a Negro boy called Billy, and their increases, to her and her heirs for ever.
Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Wyatt, and the heirs of hers
lawfully begotten, three Negro Girls one named Chalk, one Doll, another
Jenny, and a Negro Boy called Jack, and their increases, to her and her heirs for ever.
Item. I give and bequeath to my Son Edward Wyatt, and the heirs of his
lawfully begotten, the Plantation whereon Robert Cates Liveth, and all the
Land appertaining to it, I also give him two hundred acres of Land at Nottoway
River, three Negro Men, Cook, Dick and Nick, Two Negro Woman Frank and Susan,
a Negro Girl Judah, and a Negro Boy called Harry, and their increases, and my
Burkaneer Gun, to him and his heirs for ever.
I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Wyatt, and the heirs of his

a Negro your servant
Buckanacker, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my Son James Wyatts, and the heirs of his body
lawfully begotten, my Plantation wherupon I live, and all the Land
appertaining to it, I also give him three Negro Men, Jany, Jack, and Frank, three
Negro Women, Moll, Bess, and Jenny, two Negro Boys, Parrot, and Harry, my
Gun what has the Silver Sights, and my Troopers Arms, Pistols, Holsters, Car-
bines, Sables, and Maps, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item: It is also my Will and Desire that if any of my sons and Daughters
before named dye without heirs of their body Lawfully begotten, that their
part shall goe to the next heir in Law, and it is my desire that none of the
Negroes may be removed, but put under overseer to Work for to maintain the
Children, and to pay Debts, and that the said Negro Woman Moll must not be
torn or in the great House, and if she live till my son
James, comes of Age, that he must take care of her so long.

And for the rest of my personal Estate I would not have it brought to an
Appraisement but be equally divided amongst my Children.

And Lastly I make, constitute and Ordain my Trusty Friends M^r
Robert Hall, Doctor John Hamersley, and M^r James Wick, to be Joint Ex-
ecutors of this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking & Disannul-
ling all former Wills, and Testaments made by me. In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal the 29th of Dec^r 1722.
