bearing Date the Eleventh day of May, in the Year of our Lord, One thousand
Seven hundred and twenty four, and by him duly Executed, did make, Ordain, Con-
stitute and Appoint me the said Eliza both, by the Name of Elizabeth Taylor
his Dear & Loving Wife, to be his true and lawful Attorney, giving full power
unto me the sd Elizabeth full power and Authority for and in his Name and behalf
but to his Use, to his Demand, Use for, recover and receive, all and singular
Debts, demands of Money, Goods, Effects and Things from all persons whatsoever
as there were or any thing due or should be due, owing or belonging unto
him, and upon receipt of any claim or sum of Money, Compositions or Agreements
to make and give sufficient Discharge, for the same, And the said Richard
Taylor did also in and by his said Letter of Attorney further Impower me
to Substitute one or more Attorneys under me, and again at pleasure to revoke
and Revoke me and Concerning the premises to do and say by myself or Substi-
tute as fully and amply, and also to Transact and Accomplish all things what-
soever, as the said Richard Taylor might or could have done, were he
personally present, as in and by the said Letter of Attorney duly proved & recorded
in the Court of Sessions of this Island, relation being thereunto had in Court
and may more fully appear. Now know ye that by Virtue of the
aforesaid Power and Authority, I have given and granted by the said Letter of Attorney

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his Dear & Loving Wife, to be his true and lawful Attorney, giving full power
unto me the sd. Elizabeth full power and Authority for and in his Name and behalf
but to his life, to his Demand, due for, recover and receive all and Singular

to make and give sufficient Discharge for the same, And the said Richard

to substitute one or more Attorneys under me, and again at pleasure to revoke
and finally in and Concerning the premises to do and say by myself or substi-
tute as fully and amply as the said Richard Taylor might or could have done, were he
personally present, as in and by the said Letter of Attorney duly proved & recorded
in the Secretarys Office of the sd. Island is taken being thereunto had & done
and may more fully appear. Now know ye that by Virtue of the
aforesaid Power and Authority given by the said Letter of Attorney
I my self and the said Richard Taylor, have made, ordained, constituted
appointed my good friend Charles Fisher Master of the said
County fully my true and lawful Attorney for me in and
about the said of Money, Debts, Effects and Things to do and say
as fully and amply as the said Richard Taylor might or could have done, were he
personally present, as in and by the said Letter of Attorney duly proved & recorded
in the Secretarys Office of the sd. Island is taken being thereunto had & done
and may more fully appear.

Taylor, by Deed of a Bond by him the said Richard Moreley duly sealed, bearing
Date the twenty fourth day of April in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand three
hundred and twenty four, for the Penal Sum of Forty pounds Current Money of
this Island, and upon receipt thereof, Compositions or Agreements to give general
Releases and Discharges for the same, and generally in and concerning the premises
to do all things as fully and to all Intents and purposes as myself might have done,
being personally present to the Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the Second Day of November Anno Domini, One Thousand, Seven Hundred, and twenty
five.
