

Wynne Dr. In the Name of God, Amen. October the 16th 1725. I Frances Wynne of
Bristol Parish in Prince George County, being sick and weak of Body, but of sound
Mind and memory for which I thankfully adore the Divine Goodness, but not know-
ing how soon my change may come do make and Ordain this to be my last Will
and Testament in manner following, First and principally I do in the humblest
manner recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, trusting
through the Merits of my blessed Redeemer to receive life Immortal, and as
to my Body I commit to the Earth from whence it was taken, to be Buried at the discre-
tion of my Executor hereafter named, and my worldly goods which the Almighty has
bountifully bestowed to bestow upon me, I give as followeth
Item I Will that all my Just debts be Honourably paid, and Funerall Expence Discharged
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Cocke, one Negro Woman
named Tom, and one Negro Woman named Phillis, and the
furniture thereto belonging, and my Chest of
Clothes and all my Cloaths and my Horse and Sables, and one Indian Girl named Hannah
and give unto her the said Martha and her heirs
for ever also thirty pounds Current money to be paid by my Executor.
Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Herbert, one Negro Man named
Dick, and one large Dog named Lion, and one
Indian Girl named Phillis, and one Indian Boy named Jack, and all the Cattle
and other things of mine I give half of my Cattle and other
things to my son Richard Herbert, and the other half I give to my daughter Martha
and her heirs for ever.

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and Testament in manner following, First and principally I do in the humblest

Dress and all my Cloaths and my Horse and Sables, and one Indian Girl named Hannah, all
which I have and for her the said Martha and her heirs

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for ever as also thirty pounds Current money to be paid by my Executor.
Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Horvot, one Negro Woman named
Dor, and one Negro Woman named Beth, and one Negro Boy named Jim, and one
Indian Boy named Kate, and one Indian Girl named Joe, and all the Cattle
and swine I possess in off, and one equal half of my other Cattle, all the
Land and other things I possess in off, I give unto him the said Rich-
ard and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Horvot, one Negro Woman named
Beth, and one Negro Boy named Jim, and one Indian Girl named Picker, and the
stuffed stage of one with all the furniture thereto belonging, and my Chest of
Dress and all my Cloaths and my Horse and Sables, and one Indian Girl named Hannah, all
which I have and for her the said Mary and her heirs

I give and bequeath unto my Son Buller Herbert, and to his Heirs for ever, all the rest of my Estates both Personall and Real, and I do hereby make Constitute and appoint him the said Buller to be my whole and Sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, Revoking and making void all Wills by me heretofore made.
