In the Name of God Amen I James Jones of the Parish of Martin
his Willor & Brandon and County of Prince George being sick and weak, but prais'd be God
of sound perfect and disposing mind do hereby Declare this my last Will and
Testament in full of my estate to be binding upon me, I do hereby give, sell, assign
and convey unto my Son James Jones, and to his heirs, One hundred
acres of Land lying and being in the upper Part of the Parish of Martin
County of Prince George, being the same Land which I have now had a Plantation, being
the upper end of my plantation of Land there, Also I give to my said Son James
and to his heirs my Negro Man named Robin, also my Wheel, butter, Lard,
and of these I have more.

I give and Devise to my son Robert Jones, and to his heirs One Hundred Acres of Land, lying and being between my Plantation near the Angelica Swamp, in the County of Isle of Wight, and the Kings Line, being the upper end of my Tract of Land there; also I give to my said Son Robert and to his heirs, my Malatto Man named Will, also my Negro Man named Joseph, which he now has in his possession.

I give and Devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Glover, and to her heirs, my Negro Boy named Joe, Two Cows and Calves, and Six Rushia Leather Chairs.

I give and Devise to my Daughter Rebecca, and to her heirs, my two Girl Slaves named Hannah and Sarah, and Six Rushia Leather Chairs, three Cows and Calves, and three other young Cattle not Less than two years old each, a feather bed and furniture, three Swine and a Ram, three Sows and Pigs, an Iron pot, and a young Horse.

I give and Devise to my son John Jones, and to his heirs, One Hundred and Sixty Acres of Land, whereon I have now a Plantation near the Angelica Swamp, in the County of Isle of Wight, being all the remainder of my Tract of Land there, four Cows and Calves and four other young Cattle, not Less than two years old each, four Sows and Pigs and a young Horse; also I give and Devise to my said son David and to his heirs, my old Negro Man named Joe, and my Negro Girl named Mary, a Feather Bed and Bolster, Huggs Blankets, an Iron pot and a gun; I also give and Devise to my said son David and to his heirs for ever, Two Hundred Acres of Land on the other side of Warricks Swamp in Surry County.

I give and Devise to my son John Jones, and to his heirs for ever, One hundred and thirty Acres of Land, lying and being on the upper end of the Kings Line in the County of Isle of Wight, whereon I have now a Plantation, being all the remainder of my Tract of Land there; also four Cows and Calves, four other young Cattle not Less than two years old each, four Sows and Pigs, a young Horse and a gun. I also give and Devise to

near below Thomas Griffiths on the North side of the Blackwater Swamp in Surry County
with Three Hundred and fifty Acres of Land thereto belonging, being the upper end
and also the lower remainder of my Tract of Land there; I also give to my said son Richard
and to his heirs, my Maltese Man named Robin, and my Negro Woman named Betty
and her increase, also a featherbed and bolster, a kingly and blanket,
and also another featherbed and bolster, kingly and blanket, after the Death of
her husband Mother Jones. Two chests and a trunk, an iron pot, a copper chafin and
stock whip, aw, all my carpenter's and Cooper's Tools, Iron wedges and Saw guides, and
Brass Kettle.

I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Rebecca the Bed she lies on with
all the furniture thereto belonging, a balance featherbed and furniture, and
the possession of my Mother Jones after the Death of my said Mother, a Horse
and Saddle, Ten or twelve Iron pots, a Copper chafin, an iron pot, and a
four pound Dish, and a sugar pot.

After my said Wife and my said Son's Expenses are paid and discharged, all the

Leaving Wife Rebecca, and my son Richard Jones, for the maintenance of my said Wife and my Mother in Law Sarah Jones, during their Natural Lives, and my young Children during their Minority And I also nominate and appoint my said Wife Rebecca and my said Son Richard Executors & Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, here by revoking and making void all other Will and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th Day of February Anno Dom 1724.
