handy, and Six Pistolls that is in John Stiths handy, and two Mass & thirty six of ffour
a Chest and Table, Two Chairs, An Entry of Land Two hundred Acres lying upon the of Lac
Brook.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary One Negro Girl named Nan and One
Negro named Roger, one Feather Bed & Furniture, Six Dishes, Six Plates, Two of
Spoon, Tenker, Salt Sallet, Warming pan, Two Earthen Dishes, Chest, four Cows
and Calves, Four Sheep, Three Hundred Acres of Land lying upon Hungary
Branch, and my Will and Pleasure is that if my Daughter dye without Heirs
of her Body Lawfully begotten, then her Will is to be to my Brother Hezekiah
Morley, and my Will and Pleasure is that my Daughter may be under the care
of her Mother, till her Mother Marry or dye, and then my Will is that she should be
under the Care of my Sister Agnes Denford, and what Estate she has till she come to
the age of fourteen years old.

I give and bequeath unto my brother Jacob Mosby One Grey Colt belonging to a Bay
Mare bought of John Woodlief.

My Desire is that my Estate may not be brought to any Appraisment.
