In the Name of God Amen, I Mary Jones of the Parish of Martin Town
in Prince George County Virginie widow living still and eat in Bed
and of infirmity and unable to give writing my self for the same I do make
and make this my last Will & Testament Myselfe give and bequeath
to my son the 10 acre of land lying at the place where I now live
to the south west of the town of Martinsburg for his own
use to him during his life and after his death to his
widow and his children who shall be lawfully begotten
of her and his wife during her natural life and if she
die before him then to his children.

Sometimes I go to my Loving son John Jones, the Negro man named Longfellow, and one Negro Woman named Doll, and also a young boy called David, and one Bed and their furniture thereunto belonging.

I am dying and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate to my said Loving son John, my loving Daughter Elizabeth, and my said son Robert, to be equally divided among them, each having his share and Constituting each Young son John and Robert Executrix of the Death of Martin Brundin of my Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have set to my hand and seal this 11th Day of January, 1725.
