and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, My first I give and bequeathing
I leave to the Lord who gave it me, Hoping to receive remission of all my
Sins through the blood of my Lord Jesus Christ, and my Body I commit to the
earth to be decently interred according to the Direction of my Friends & household
friends and as for that worldly Estate which is hereby placed up to be sold you
and your heirs to perform the same in or follow all Direction

Impremis. I give to my Loving Son John Jones, one Negro Man named Pompey, and one Negro Woman named Dollo, and also a young horse called Peruff, and one Bed and the furniture thereunto belonging.

Item. I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my Estate to my said Loving Son John, my loving Daughter Elizabeth, and my loving Son Robert, to be equally divided amongst them, And I do hereby make, Ordain and Constitute my said Loving Son John, and Robert Executors of the Last Will and Testament of me, the said Mary Jones, whereof I have subscribed my hand and seal this 11th day of January 1725.
