bestowed as hereafter by this my Will is Express, and first I do revoke, renounce, frustrate and make void all Will, by me formerly made, and declare and Appoint this my last Will and Testament.

Then I give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Mary Dorce my Plantation
I now live on with the dwelling house and all other houses thereon belonging to
the same in manner as followeth, that She my self Wife During the Term of her
Widow hood shall peaceably enjoy the same to her own proper use and benefit
provided she shall live and abide her self in person upon the sd Plantation
but in case she shall either marry or remove her self from living on the B-
plantation as above said, then my Will is that she shall only have one third part
thereof during her natural life.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Abraham Jones a part of my Land
Lying and being on Prince of Georges Co. Wm. 47 13 1728 Run commonly so called, bound
as followeth, Viz. ¹ www.mtgoridians.net Joining on my Son in Law Peter Jones his
Line, and from that Line up the Run to a Branch called the Indian Cornfield
Branch and up the Branch to my head line, Containing about Seventy or Eighty
Acres of Land, be it more or less, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Peter Jones the remaining part of my
Land I now live on, excepting what I have given and bequeathed to my Son
Abraham Jones, that is to say, that my ^{my Wife} Loving Wife Mary Jones live and abide
on the same during her Natural Life.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Jones all my land lying on the upper side of the forest of Baford Branch, containing about one hundred Acres of Land more or less, to him and his heirs for ever.

Great Creek, so called, on Halloway River, to contain one hundred and fifty Acres of
Land, out of one hundred and fifty Acres to be taken out of my tract of

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Jones my part of
Great Creek so called, on Hottoway River, to contain One hundred and fifty Acres of
Land, what of One hundred and fifty Acres to be taken out of my share of
Land of Four hundred Acres, not spoiling the other of the 1/2 I divided to him &
his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Jones, One hundred and fifty Acres
of some being part of the forasaid four hundred Acres upon Great Creek on Hottoway
River on this side the 1/2 Creek joining on the Land of Indian Wells down the Creek
to contain One hundred and fifty Acres of Land, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Wood Jones, One hundred Acres of Land
joining upon my son Thomas Jones his land, down the forasaid Great Creek to him
and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Abraham Jones, my Two Slaves by Name
Tom and Sarah ^{Prince of George Co. Wills 1713-1728} to him and his heirs
for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Jones, Wife of Peter Jones, a
Mutt of the same Mark she and her increase, and also my Silver Tob Pipe to her &
her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Peter Jones, my Mutt of a Slave named
Hannah and also a feather Bed and Pillow One Ring One Blanket and One
gown of pete to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Jones, my Mutt of a Slave named
Mary and also a feather Bed and Pillow One Ring One Blanket and One gown of pete
to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Jones, my Mutt of a Slave named
Sarah and also a feather Bed and Pillow One Ring One Blanket and One gown of pete
to him and his heirs for ever.

One Rugg, one Blankett, one pair of Sheets, to him and his heirs for ever.
 Item. I give and bequeath to my son John Jones, One Mattato Tellow named Jack, and
 his den chub, and one Mattatto Tye named Susan, One Feather Bed and bolster, one Rugg, one
 Blankett, one pair of sheets, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Wood Jones, one Mattatto Tellow named Daniel
 and one Tye named James, and one Tye named Tomp, One feather bed and bolster, one Rugg, one
 Blankett, one pair of sheets, and my deat Ring, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anne Jones, my Matta. Slave named Poppe, and
 her increase, one feather bed and bolster, one Rugg, one Blankett, one pair Sheets, and my
 Silver Tumbler, to her and her heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Jones, my Matta. Slave named
 Frank, and her increase, one Feather bed and bolster, one Rugg, one Blankett, and one
 pair Sheets, to her and her heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Jones, my Matta. Slave named Mary
 and her increase, one feather bed and bolster, one Rugg, one Blankett, one pair of
 Sheets, one Silver Salt Soller, two Cans and Calves, to her and her heirs for ever.

Item. My Will is that my Matta. Slave by Name, old Sarah, her Son called Jack, Daniel and
 Rachel, lives and abide with my Wife Mary Jones, to save her, her Natural Life, without let or
 Molestation of any person or persons whatever, and at her Decease, my Will is that my son Peter
 Jones have my Matta. Woman Rachel, and to him and his heirs forever, and my Will is, if
 hence forward the foresaid Rachel have any increase, the first after my Decease to be given
 to my son William Jones, and his heirs for ever, whatever increase afterwady from her
 I give to my son Peter Jones, and his heirs for ever.

At also my Will is that after my Wife's Decease, my son Wood Jones have my Matta. Slave
 Daniel to him and his heirs for ever.

Also my Will is after my Wife's Decease, my Daughter Anne Jones, have my Matta. Slave
 named old Sarah, to her and her heirs for ever.

Item. My Will is that if any of the foresaid Legators, of my four sons, viz. William Jones

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 with Virginia Pioneer

Also my Will is after my Wife decess, my Daughters, Anne Jones, have my Malt. House named with Sarah to her and her heirs for ever.

Item. My Will is that if any of the forsaide Legates, of my four Sons, viz. William Jones, Thomas Jones, John Jones and Wood Jones, depart this life before they attain to Lawful Age, that his or their part or parts of Land be equally divided among the Survivors.

And further my Will is that if any of my seven Legates, by Name William Jones, Thomas Jones, John Jones, Wood Jones, Anne Jones, Margaret Jones and Martha Jones, depart this life, before they are possesse of what is herein of this my Will given and bequeath, that his or her part or parts be equally divided among the Survivors of the forsaide seven Legates, to them and their heirs for ever.

All the Malt of my Estate not yet disposed of, my Will is that it should remain in the possession and custody of my loving Wife, Mary Jones, during her Natural life hereafter. And as to be divided between my two Sons John Jones and Wood Jones to them and their heirs for ever.

And further my Will is that my Executors hereafter named, proportion and divide the same according to the direction of this my Last Will and Testament.

And I do hereby with make, ordain, constitute and appoints my Trusty Beloving Friend Mr. Robert Mansford, and my Son Peter Jones, my full sole and sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day and year first above written.

 on the second Tuesday in January being the Tenth Day of the 1st Month
 Anno Dom: 1726.

The next before written Last Will and Testament of Peter Jones Dead
 was presented into Court by Robert Munford and Peter Jones Jun^r his Executors
 who made Oath thereto, and it being prov^d by the Oaths of Nathaniel Parrott
 Daniel Jones, George Williams, and James Thompson, Witnesses thereto, by Order
 of the Court is truly Recorded, and on the motion of the s^d Robert Munford and
 Peter Jones, and their giving Security, Certificate is granted them for obtaining
 a Probate of the s^d Will in due form.
