ner at the Discretion of my Executors hoping that at
the general Resurrection I shall receive the same by the
Almighty power of God, and as for such Worldly Estate where-
with it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I
give and bequeath of the same in the following manner
and form.

Impremis I give and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Lee
Three hundred and thirty Acres of Land be the same

Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel the
Sum of three hundred and thirty Acres of Land lie the same
more or less Beginning at the mouth of Bull Branch at
a Tapsprats Corner thence down the great Branch to the
line thence along the line to Bonners Branch thence
the same to a Corner White Oak thence along a line
of marked trees to the ready Branch thence across the said
Branch to James McQuills line thence along the said
line to a high landward thence along the same
to a small branch of the head branch thence down the
same to the main Bull Branch thence down the Bull Branch
to the water spring corner where it began at the beginning
the plan also on the map. The same is called the "New" now

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Lee the
plantation whereon he now liveth containing four hun
dred and thirty Acres be the same more or less to him and his
heirs forever, I also give and bequeath to my said son Thomas
Lee and his heirs three negro Slaves named, Roger, Comrey
Wadd, and also the negroes that he has now in possession
one Croquet Saw one half of my Cash, Bottles, Cyder and

one croquet ball one half of my estate,

Brandy one gun and two leather Chairs

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Bang

and her heirs forever my negro Woman Fillis and negr

Woman Tobe which she has in her possession one Desk

one Oval Table one Feather bed and Furniture and two

leather Chairs.

Item I give to my Grandson Samuel Bang five new

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Chambers

the use of my negro Woman Jancy during her Natural life

and after her decease I give the said negro Woman Jancy of

her Increase to be equally divided amongst all my said

Daughter Sarah Chambers Children and their heirs forever

I bequeath to my said Daughter Chambers and her heirs

an undivided share which she has in my said

estate

Item I give to my grand daughter Frances Chamberlain and her
heirs forever my negro girl called Beck one feather bed and
furniture one cow and calf and one looking glass but if my
said grand daughter Frances Chamberlain dies before she attains
the age of Twentyone years or without lawful heirs then
I give the said negro girl Beck and all the other things given
to the said Frances Chamberlain to my grand daughter Eliza
beth Chamberlain and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Chamberlain
and his heirs one negro woman called Hannah which he
has in possession

Item I give to my grandson Abraham Chamberlain five pounds

Item I give to my grand daughter Sarah Chamberlain five pounds
current money

Item I give to my grand daughter Amy Williams five pounds

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Peter Chamberlain
and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Peter Chambliss
and his Heirs forever Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land
joining the Land of Wm Baugh Samuel Lee Junr and
Thomas Owen. I also give to my said grandson Peter Chamb
liss and his Heirs forever my negro boy Dick, but if my
said grandson Peter Chambliss should die before he attains
the Age of Twenty one years or without lawfull heirs
then I give the said negro boy Dick to be equally divided ^{between}
his two Sisters ^{Princess of George Co Wills 1780} ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} the Chambliss to them
and their Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Samuel Lee Junr
of my son Thos Lee and his Heirs forever my Tract of Land
whereon I now live containing six hundred Acres be
ing or less and I desire that my said gra son
Samuel Lee shall take possession of my said Tract of Land
within one year after the death of the said Thos Lee

Witness my hand and seal this 10th day of May 1780
at my house in the County of Stafford

Then I give and bequeath unto my Grandson William
Brough and to his Heirs forever one Bed and Furniture my
Riding Horse Brance and Saddle and Bridle two Cows and Calves
two Sows and Pigs

Then I give to my Grand Daughter Frances Charable my
Horse Bitch and my wifes Saddle and bridle a small Kettle,
a small Trunk, and a Flowered Butter pot after my
wifes decease.

Then I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Brough one Cow and
Calf

Then my Will and desire is that loving wife Frances do
have full possession of my whole Estate and that nothing be
removed of the plantation whereon I now live during her
natural life and that she be no ways Molested except with
her consent

Then all the rest and residue of my Estate both Real and
personal I give to be equally divided amongst all my Children
over and their Heirs forever.

I appoint my two Sons Samuel

Lastly I constitute and appoint my two sons Samuel
and Thomas Lee Executors of this my last Will and Testa-
ment and I direct that my Estate be not appraised as
I invoke all other Wills heretofore by open made and con-
