point, to him and his heirs for ever; I also give my son John the Right
and Survey of the said Entry of Land, I also give my son John the Sum
of Ten pounds at the Day of his coming to Age, I also give my son John
a likely young Mair and Colt, I also give my son John a young brock
Horn, Bridle & Saddle, to be delivered to him at the time of his coming
to Age, to him and his heirs for ever. I also give my son John three
young Cows and Calves, and a Featherbed and Furniture to the Cost of
Ten pounds to him and his heirs for ever. I also give unto my son John
all the Remainder part of my Money that is in my House and what
Major Munford Owes ^{to} me, to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Dorothy Clay her Featherbed
and Furniture as it now stands, I also give unto my Daughter Dorothy one black
Mair called Bob and her filly, I also give my Daughter Dorothy two Cows and
Calves, and three pewter Dishes, and 2 plates two deep ones and a Plate one
I also give my Daughter Dorothy her Chest, I also give my Daughter Dorothy
the sum of 25 pounds Credit in Colonel Ballings Store.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Clay the parcel of Stoggs as
he calls his hogs.

Item I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Phoebe & Hannah the sum
of thirty pound a piece if my stock will fetch it, otherwise to be made

Item I give and bequeath to my two Daughters I Hebe & Hannah, the sum of thirty pound a piece if my stock will fetch it, otherwise to be made up in household stuff, to be paid them on the Day of Marriage or then coming to age.

Item I give and bequeath all the rest of my personal Estate after my Death Funerall Charges and Legacies is paid, to be Equally Divided among all my Children.

Item I give and bequeath to John Fitzgerald, my son John Clay till he comes to the age of 21 years, or During the life of John Fitzgerald's life.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Charles two Shares of the Crop that is now growing upon my Plantation, and the Remainder to my son James.
