In the Name of God, Amen, January the 28th 1727. I Thomas Griffith of
Brandon Parish, in Prince Georges County, being very sick and weak, but of perfect
sence and memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament, first I sincerely
I deliver my Soul to Almighty God, that gave it me, my Body to the Earth to be
Decently Buried. As for my Worldly Goods, it hath pleased God to send me with
I dispose as followeth

Item. I give and bequeath to my Brother John Griffith, my Negro Wench named
Rau, and my Child, and my old Gun, to him and his Heirs.

Item. I give to my Sister Hannah Griffith, my Negro Boy named Jack, and in Case
this said Hannah should dye without Issue, then shall this said Negro Boy goe
to my Nephew William Griffith, Son of John Griffith, and furthermore do oblige
this said John Griffith to provide for this said Boy, and let his Mother
Suckle him, till he is two years old, then shall this said Hannah take him, and
also I give this said Hannah four pair of good strong Shags, to be paid by my
Executor, when she shall think fitt to send them.

Item. I give unto my Brother William Griffith, all the Cattle which I have,
or is due to me, and all my stock of Hogs, with all my Corn and Tobacco,
horses and two saddles, and Carpenter's Tools, and my new Gun, and all my house-
hold Goods in generall.

Item. I give to my Brother Richard Griffith, all my Cattle and Two Barrels
of Corn.

And Lastly I do appoint my Brother John and William Griffith my whole
and sole Executors.
