In the name of God, Amen. the fourteenth Day of October, in the year of  
our Lord God 1716. I Thomas Lewis of Prince George County, being Sick of Body,  
but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, therefore calling unto  
mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men  
once to dye, Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, that is to say  
principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of God  
that gives it, and for my Body, I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a  
Christian-like and decent manner, at the discretion of my Executors, nothing  
doubting but at the generall resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty  
power of God, and as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased  
God to bless me in this life, I give, Devise and Dispose of the same in the  
following manner, to wit:

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In presence I give and bequeath unto my son John Lewis, the sum of  
five shillings sterling money.  
I give and bequeath unto my daughter, one for the  
third and furniture thereunto belonging.  
I give and bequeath unto my son John Lewis that tract of Land on  
which he now Liveth, it being One hundred Acres, more or less, to him my  
said son John Lewis, and his heirs for ever.

I Likewise give and bequeath unto my said son John Lewis all  
the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate both personal, & real, and do  
hereby Constitute make and Ordain my said son John Lewis whole Ex-  
ecutor of this my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and Seale the Day and year first above written.

hereby Constitute make and Ordain my said son John Lewis whole Ex-
