But to be fully satisfied of the same During her Naturall life I also leave to my said loving Wife During her Naturall life the use and of four Negro Slaves by Name Simon Jamey Ben and Betty.

Now my will and desire further is and it is my true Intent and meaning that the said Land, Plantation, and Slaves the use of which is left to my said Wife as above I give and Devise the said Land Plantation and four Slaves by Name above mentioned After my said Wifes Decease unto my Nephew William Chamblee and to his Heirs forever.

And to his heirs forever unto my Kinsman William Chamblep

from give and Bequeath unto my said Kinsman William Chamblep
Four Cattle and four Sheep over and above more than what Stock
of that kind I have already given him and Now in his Possession

I also give him what Household Furniture he has in his possession
to him and his heirs forever

from all the rest ^{and} residue of my Personal Estate I give and Bequeath
unto my said Loving Wife Agnate Chamblep to be by her Disposal
of as she shall think proper
