Will and Testament, hereby Revoking all former Will
or Wills by me heretofore made

Importunus, my will and Power is that all my Just Debts
and Funeral Expenses be first paid and Discharged

Item my Will and Power is that the Extended Land I Pur
chased of Thomas Henwellin, formerly belonging to James
Hobbs be sold at Publick Auction To the Highest bidder and the
Money arising therefrom to be Applied Towards discharging
my said Debts

First I give and devise unto my Sonnaman William Hen
wellin one hundred acres of Land to the same man or his heirs
to have and use of a homestead to him and his heirs for
ever and I give and devise unto my said Sonnaman William Hen
wellin all my Furniture and household goods to him and his heirs for
ever

And I give and devise unto my said Sonnaman William Hen
wellin all my other goods and chattels to him and his heirs for
ever

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the living as the gift for use

I give and devise unto my loving Wife agraft Charnbley, or
Negro woman Nann and her young Child called Anthony, and
Negro Girl called to her and her heirs forever.

Now, my will and desire is that my said loving Wife agraft Char-
bley shall be seised of my Tract of Land whereon I now dwell be-
tweening Two Hundred and Seventy Two Acres including my
Plantation and all improvements thereunto belonging wi-
thout any Reversion or Mortuagage to any Person Whatsoever

But to be fully paid of the same During her Natural life
I also leave to my said loving Wife During her Natural life
the sole use of four Negro Slaves, by Name Simon, Jemmy, Peter, and
Betty.

Now my will and desire further is and it is my true intent
and meaning that the said Land, Plantation, and Slaves the use of
which is left to my said Wife as above I give and Devise the said
Land Plantation and four Slaves by Name above mentioned
After my said Wifes Decease unto my Minors William Charles

After my Last Wifes Decease unto my Kinsman William Chamblee
And to his Heirs Forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto my said Kinsman William Chamblee
Four cattle and four Sheep over and above more than what Stock
of That kind I have already given him and Now in his Possession
I also give him what Household Furniture he has in his possession
To him and his Heirs Forever

Item all the rest ^{and} residue of my Personal Estate I give & Bequeath
unto my said Loving Wife a single Chamblee to be by her Disposal
of as she shall think proper

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Item I desire that my said Will be not Appraised
but to be proved by the said de Beconstate and approved by my Loving
single Chamblee and my Kinsman William Chamblee to
be the true and lawful Executor to this my Last Will and Testament
and that the said de Beconstate be the true and lawful Executor to this my
