In the Name of God, Amen, the 22 day of April in the year of our Lord God 1728 William Grigg being sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thank; be given to God, but calling to mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye, do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hand of God that gave it, and for my Body I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner, at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, with I give and dispose of the same in the following manner, I Give

I Give to my well beloved Son John Grigg my Plantation that I now live on, his bounds being at the mouth of the Great Branch thence running up to Edward Mitchell's Line, thence crossing to the upper end of the round Swamp, being for a Hundred Acres more or less, this to my child John Grigg, and his heirs for ever.

Item I Give to my well beloved Son John Grigg the remaining part of my standing the Swamp above his brother Abner's bounds, being for Seventy Acres more or less, on the outward side of the Swamp, this I Give to my said Son John Grigg, and his heirs for ever.

Item I Give to my Father William Grigg, and Mother Sarah Grigg, and certain piece of Land between my brother James Grigg and Thomas Hall running from the Rock in the middle of the river to the rif the house, and the house to my said Father and Mother I Give for their life.

Down to the Swamp, and across the Creek to the West side Line, thence to Edward Middle Line, so down to the great branch, and thence down the branch to the Creek, it being for a hundred Acres more or less, this I give to my said son Thomas Grigg, and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give to Thomas Shackney a piece of Land on the North side of the Creek beginning at a Line marked by Consent of the said Shackney and I the sd. Wm. Grigg, so running up the Swamp for fifty Acres more or less, this I give to the sd. Thomas Shackney and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give to my Brother James Grigg a piece of Land lying between the Hockey branch and the great branch on the North side of the Creek, and so from the mouth of each branch running and binding on the two parcels before disposed of, it being for a hundred Acres more or less, this I give to my said Brother James Grigg to him and his heirs for ever.

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Item. I give to my well beloved Daughter Susannah Grigg a feather Bed, and what stands in the inner room, and the furniture belonging to it, a chair and a Trunk and half a dozen of pewter dishes, and an iron pot, this to her and her heirs.

Item. I give to my Mother Susannah Grigg my Horse called Forester, him to her and her heirs.

Item. I give to my well beloved Brother James Grigg the Remainder of my Estate which is not yet disposed of, he seeing all my just Debts paid there with which he and himself for the trouble of the same, the Remainder then which is clear shall be equally divided between my Children which are already mentioned in this Will there being five of them.

I Likewise constitute, make and Ordain my said Brother James Grigg my only and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal the Day and year first above written.

At a Court held at Fitzgeralds for the County of Prince George, on the Second Tuesday next to come, being the thirteenth Day of the said month, Anno Dom, 1726

The above written Last Will and Testament of William Gregg deceased was exhibited into Court by James Gregg his Executor, who made Oath there to, and being proved by the Oaths of Roger Moore, William Handley, and Charles Williams Witnesses, by Order of the Court it truly Recited and on the motion of the said James Gregg, and his giving Bonds and Security according to Law, Certificate is granted him for Obtaining a Probate of the said Will, due form
