IN THE NAME OF GO AMEN I, Alexander Keeling being in perfect sence to memory praise be to God for it and knowing that all men are born to but the time uncertain and being to settle my worldly estate that God in his mercy hath bestowed unto me do make this my last will be testament revoaking all former wills by meetmade Impes. I Command my soul unto the hands of God Almighty my greator hoping for salvation by the alone merritts of Jesus Christ my blessed redeemer and my body to the earth to be descently buried at the discretion of my Extr. hereafter mentioned: I give and bequeath to my eldest son Edward Keeling one young negro man named Ned to be immediately after my decease yet not withstanding my will is and it is my will that my wife Grace Keeling have ye labour and use of his during her

bequest unto my leving wife Grace Keeling the plantation I now live on during her natural life and after her decease to my son Edward Keeling and his heirs forever as also my will is the my said son Edward Keeling have liberty to part & live one my part of the said land after I shall arrive to the age of twenty and one years the said land and plantation is to be divis from my other land that I have given to his brothers by a line of marked trees runing east f on the head of a branch that comes out of the posson lying near northeast from the house and is the branch that the road goes over where the poson winds away near south west and is about three or four hundred pards from ye cleard ground: I give and bequeath to my son Thorougood Keeling a certain tract of land adjoining on ye land that I have given to my son Edward and a Northerly along the presson to ye log bridg from thence by an east line easterly bounds the said land being known by the name of dogwood ridg the said land I give to my said Thoroughood and his heires forever and in case my son Thorowgood should die without fresh heires lawfully begotten of his body then I give ye ad land to my daughter Grace Keeling and to her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever and for want of such heires to the next of blood; I give to my said son Thorowgood Keeling one silver porringer markt TA to him and his heires forever; 61y; -- I do give to my ad son Thorowgood Keeling one negro boy named Jack to him and him heires forever and in wase my said son Thorowgood should die without such lawfull heires begotter of his body, then I give ye so negro Jack to my son Robert Keeling and his helres forever to be immediately his after my decease yt notwithstanding my will is and it is my will that my wife Grace Keeling hath the labor and use of ye ad negro Jack during her natural life provided she doth not remove ye ad negro Jack out of this County. Thy--- I give to my eidest son Edward one silver tumbler with a coat of armes on it to him and his helres forever Sly --- I gave and bequeath to my son Robert Keeling a certain tract of land adjoining on John Oakhams land and so south along ye proson to the logg bridge and from thence to be divided. from his brother Thorowgood Land by an east line to him my ad son Rebert Keeling and his beirs larfully begotten of his body forever and in case my sd son mobert should dye without such heires lawfully begotten of his body then I doe give the said land to my son Nm. and his heirs forever. 91y --- I doe give to my aforesaid two sons Robert Keeling and William Keeling one negro boy named Charles to them or their survivor of them and their heires forever yt it is my will and my will is notwithstanding what is above that my wife Grace have ye labor and ye us of the said negro boy Charles during her natural life provided always that she do not remove him out of this said County. 10, ly I doe give unto my daughter Grade Keeling one two year old heifer to be delivered to her immediately after my decease in full of her part of my estate. 11-ly--- I doe give to my daughter Anne Keeling one two year old heifer in full of her part of my estate to be delivered to her immediately after my decease. 12-ly--- I doe give unto my daughter Elizabeth Keeling one two year old heifer in full of her part of my estate to be delivered to her immediately after my decease. 15-ly--- I doe give to my grand daughter Pembrook one you lamb to be delivered as above, lastly I do give to my loving wife Brace Keeling one negro somen called Charcole and and doe also give to my ad wife all the rest of my personal and beveable estate within dores and without she paying my just debts apointing my said wife Grace Keeling my full and whole executrix of this my last will & testant.
