

To all &c. Whereas &c. Now know ye that I the said Francis Nicholson Esq. Governor &c. do with the advice & consent of the Council of State according by law and grant unto Robert Coale one hundred thirty four acres of Land situate & being in the Lower parish of Nansemond County on the Eastern side of Nansemond river beginning at a Catwood tree by the river side near Sleepy hole & running thence South Easterly thirty eight degrees joining to the Land of John Peters one hundred forty four poles to a pine thence South Easterly thence by right degrees bounding on the said Peters one hundred ninety four poles to a pine standing in Bolton's Line thence down the said Line North Westerly six degrees bounding on Bolton two hundred ninety eight poles to a Gum stump standing on the river side thence running up the said river the several Courses thereof & bounding thereon to the first mentioned station. the said Land being formerly granted to Richard Russell Esq. by patent dated the 27th of August 1693 & by the said Russell sold and assigned to Edward Dancer & since found to Dechoat to his Maj^{ty} and after granted to Thomas Jarrot Esq. by patent dated the sixth day of April 1691. who by his last will and testament gave the same to Sarah his wife who intermarried with the said Robert Coale. To all &c. Whereas &c. Now know ye that I the said Francis Nicholson Esq. Governor &c. do with the advice & consent of the Council of State according by law and grant unto John Hopkins two hundred & ten acres of Land lying and being in Princess Anne County on both sides of the Gun Swamp beginning at a marked bush a corner tree of John Murrins Land & running thence along his Line South Westerly thence by right degrees one hundred & forty poles to a bush thence beginning at the first mentioned marked bush & running thence crossing the Gun Swamp North Westerly forty two degrees twenty poles to a bush thence North Westerly Sixty six degrees ninety six poles to a pine thence North Westerly forty two degrees one hundred poles to a maple thence South Westerly eight degrees one hundred & six poles to a Gum standing by a great Dogwood called the Groone tree thence running through the same South Easterly forty five degrees three hundred eighty and two poles to the second mentioned bush the said Land being due unto the said John Hopkins Esq. and for the transportation of five persons into this Colony whose names are to be in the records mentioned under this patent. To have & to hold &c. To be hold &c. By selling & paying &c. Provided &c. Given under my hand & the Seal of the Colony this 24th Day of April Anno Dom 1703. —
