and by these presents for us our heirs and assigns do give grant and confirm unto Jason Moore one certain Tract or parcel of land
containing two hundred twenty two acres, lying and being in Lynnhaven parish in the sh^{re} of Denyse Anno at a place called Woodhouses
damme and joining to Moores Creek on the Eastern shore and bounded as followeth to wit^h beginning at a white oak standing by the
side of the Reddy branch a line bee of Allens gablet and running thence bounding on a line of markt head dividing this and the
Land of the s^d. Allen North easterly forth four poles to a white oak, thence South easterly fifty nine
degrees forty eight poles on Allens line of markt head to a Elm upon standing by a branch of Woodhouses damme, thence bounding
on a line of markt head dividing this Land and the Land of Eliz^a. Diers North two hundred thirty four poles passing a small
branch of Woodhouses damme to a Elm upon stake thence bounding on a line of markt head dividing this Land and the Land of
Lewis Provins South easterly eighty degrees one hundred fifty two poles to a Elm upon stake in Lewis Provins line of markt
head, thence bounding on a line of markt head dividing this Land and the Land of Lewis Provins passing the head of Moores
Creek South two hundred eighty two poles to a Maple standing by the side of the Reddy branch, thence running up the Reddy branch

confirm unto Henry Gilbert one certain tract or parcel of Land containing four hundred acres lying and being upon his West side
situate in the parish of Wilmington in the County of Sussex City and bounded as followeth to wit, beginning at two
corner red oaks in the Woods being a corner of this, the Manor of Castleme Barroet and of the Lands of Simon Possour
thence along a new line of eight hundred and fifty acres of w^{ch} this is part (the whole curious bounds being utterly unknowne) south westerly
thence degree easterly one hundred and fifty fathoms to a red oak and two English on the run side of his Lower or pasturage vicarage of
