George the second To all whome it shall come to the knowledge of that for diverse Causes and Considerations but more especially for and in Consideration of the sum of £¹⁰⁰⁰ Killings of goods and Lawfull Money for our use paid to our Treasurer or General of our Treasuries in this our Colony and Dominion of Virginia We have given Grant and confirmed and by these presents do for us our heirs and Successors do give Grant and confirm unto John Middleton and certain Elact or parcel of Land containing Twenty Acres across and on each side being on the Eastern shore of Litchaven River in the County of princeps annus and bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning at a corner Maple in the East Swamp and running North West seventy eight degrees eighty poles Thence North West sixty three or sixty four poles to a white oak Stake Thence South East twelve degrees thirty minutes one hundred and forty poles to a Hickory Thence South East eighty four degrees one hundred and twenty five poles to a Gum Thence North East thirteen degrees one hundred and four poles to the Beginning **Witness** all which we have Read and heard read and paying or provided as in witness whereunto our Trusty and well beloved William Gooch Esq^r our Lieut^g Governor and Commander in Chief of our said Colony and Dominion at Williamsburgh under the Seal of our said Colony the Twenty eighth day of September One thousand seven hundred and Thirty in the fourth year of our reign

George the second To all whome these things shall come Given Grant and confirmed and by these presents for us our heirs and Successors do give Grant and confirm unto Joseph Bonwell Murriner one certain Tract or parcel of Land containing five hundred and twenty one Acre or lying and being on both sides Hargis Creek in the County of Brunswick aforesaid and bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning at John Robertsons great Red Oak Corner on the North side the Creek thence along Robertsons line North two degrees East one hundred fifty four poles to a small Black Oak thence East eight degrees North two hundred fifty eight poles to Strouds line thence South twenty three degrees West one hundred and two poles along Strouds line to a White Oak thence continuing his line West thirty two degrees South one hundred and eight poles to a Red Oak thence South twenty four degrees East one hundred and eighty four poles to Henry Morris's Corner Red Oak thence along Morris's line East one hundred fifty nine poles to Arthurs Corner thence along his line North twenty four degrees East one hundred and forty poles to the Creek thence down the Creek as it Meanders to the Beginning Witness our Trusty and Well beloved William Gooch Esq. our Lieut Governor and Commander in Chief of our said Colony and Dominion at Williamsburg the tenth day of September one thousand seven hundred and thirty in the fourth year of our reign.
