one Cow and Calf one Cow and Lamb one Chest and
Bed and furniture to her and her heirs for Ever -

Item I give and Bequeath unto my well beloved wife Dinah
all the rest of my Estate of What kind soever it be within
and without Doors During her life Afterwards I give unto
my Son David Fentress to him and his heirs for Ever -
excepting one Heifer Yearling I give unto my Son
Michael Fentress after my wife's Decease to him and
his heirs for Ever - also one Heifer I give to my Grands
Daughter Ginneth May after my wife's Decease to her
and her heirs for Ever - Nominating and appointing
my Son David Fentress as Executor of this my last -
