of most uncertain & being desirous to settle that I make Tomorowk Estate which I have plaid so  
god in my ey to lond me: Do therfore make to this my last will & Testament in manner & in following  
first principle I beg uath my soul to almighty god my honourable father true & hopeing  
that it through his blessed death & passion of my only saviour Iesus Christ to redie: no pardon &  
remission of my sins so forced by my body to garnish from whence it came to be worthy burier  
any execration of my self herafter named: - I giue & be o<sup>r</sup> my oath to my son Robert Burrough that  
these of land shadow w<sup>m</sup>: Burrough now lies unformly belonging to his vnde R<sup>t</sup>: Burrough to  
him this heire for his wife & his sonnes & my dear & louing wife Frances the plantation  
sheer now lies for during her natural life left in to my son Arthur Burrough & to his  
sons for success of my son Arthur Burrough to be his sonnes & said lands whon he cometh to y<sup>e</sup> age of one  
twenty years then his mother to assign him a part at her discretion whereinto he & but in case  
my two sonnes Robert & Arthur should die both of them without children then do give both thair  
share of said land to my daughter Eliz: Burrough her heirs for ever: I giue to each of my sons a gun a gun  
& a horse & to my son Robert my wife after his mothers decease I giue to my daughter Eliz: Sir for  
what she had in money as if day of her marriage also of her bed & furniture to be delivered her at & day  
of her marriage & give unto my well beloued wife Frances a singular lot of my personal estate  
of what kind naturall & quality soone after she my self is fully paid & discharged my wife should so w<sup>t</sup>  
ceding death then do give my goods to her child if fit to possesse after my wife do decease as follows  
I give to my neare marriag<sup>e</sup> daughter Eliz: after her mothers decease & do now give to my said w<sup>t</sup>  
beloued wife Frances a whole lot of this my last will & Testament in writing wherof I have  
wrote it & my hand affixed my Tenth day of March anno Domini 1711
