my aforesaid daughter Mary one negro man named Fox & one negro woman named
Goche with all her future increase unto her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body
for ever provided that if she nor any such lawful heir do not come within y^e space
of seven years after my decease that then I give y^e said negroes & their increase unto
my daughter Ann Kingman to her & y^e heirs of her body lawfully begotten of her body
unto Ann Scott fifty shillings for & towards the bury of her body. - It. I give unto
Mary moors formerly Mary Lossly five pounds - It. I give unto my two daughters
Mary & Ann Kingman four yards & a half of downland & a half of garden
three remnants of Calicoe four yards of striped & colored maulin a remnant of
striped louting & four silk handkerchiefs which is now in my house to be equally
divided between them - It. I give unto my daughter Ann Kingman my plantation
whereon I now live with all y^e lands & appurtenances thereunto belonging & all the stock
of cattle & hogs & other for the room & negroes named as followeth Stone, Tom, & Susa & all
her future increase y^e said land & negroes I give to my daughter Ann & y^e heirs of her
body lawfully begotten for ever, & she to be possessed of all my estate as I have given
her by this my will when she attains to y^e age of fifteen years, but if in case my
said daughter should die without heirs as aforesaid that then I give all that I have
given her by this my will that is to say my plantation & negroes for & towards the
support & maintenance of a free school for the bringing up of poor orphan children to
education & good learning that y^e said free school be kept upon my land & the said
negroes too for the full support of a master to perform y^e duty as aforesaid and to no
other use whatsoever; - It. I give unto m^r. Charles Sayer one horse called by the
name of old buck one bridle & saddle to be delivered to them after my decease - It. I give
unto my daughter Ann Kingman all the residue & remainder of my estate both
real & personal not before disposed off by this my will after all my just debts and
expences abated under y^e same limitations & instructions as is before proposed by
this my will. & I do order & appoint that my said daughter Anne do live with m^r.
Robecca Bax two years & she to be paid out of my estate for & towards her bringing
of her up during y^e said time with a good & sufficient maintenance and allowance
for y^e same; - And lastly I do make & ordain constitute & appoint m^r. Charles Sayer a
cap^t. Francis Land to be my whole & sole Exors of this my last will & desires that they
will do it wth faithfulness & performed In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & scale & for the full confirmation of all what is before written this seventh d^y.
