I nominate now whom that all my debts & funeral charges be accounted & paid —
Item I give & bequeath to unto my loving wife Mary Bonney all & every good & all
chattel which I had by her out of the estate of my predecessor John Danby Esq: and one
young breeding mare with her foal & interest also I give her one feather bed & fur
niture such as belongeth to it during her naturall life: also I give unto my said wife
fiftynounpound Cash in m^t Thomas Walkers hands & fiftypound in her pockes from Cash
also I likewise give to my said wife & use of one young negro wench called Hobo for
twelvemonths by that time theresho may purchase another: — It I give to my
daughter Mary Gornto all that she has in possession I likewise give to my said Daughter
one negro boy called Sam: to her & her heirs for ever also one small Chest: It I give &
bequeath unto my daughter Frances Bonney the above named negro wench & to
her increase to her & her heirs for ever also give her one feather bed she has in
possession & two Iron pots one ton galons & one about three gallons. & one small
Table & four plank bottoms chairs & two chests one large one end & one small & one
morter & pestle & smoothing Iron: — Item I give & bequeath to Frances my daugh-
ter one tract plantation of land being the north end of Long Island begining on
the East Side of said Island at an old fence made by Dennis Cross & so along if said
fence to the western landing being eighty acres more or less to her & the heirs of
her body begotten: — It I give all my cattle to my three children John Bonney Mary
Gornto & Frances Bonney to be equally divided amongst them: — It I give my power
to be divided between my Son John & daughter Frances Bonney as Equally as they can
do it & all my sheep both men & women likewise: — It I give & bequeath to my Son John
Bonney two plantations containing two hundred acres or thereabouts more or less
the second whereon he now liveth & the remainder part of Long Island that belongeth to me
one negro man & one negro woman called Doctor & Rose the land to be divided to him & his
heirs for ever: — Lastly as for the rest of my estate both personal & real I give to
my Son John Bonney appointing him sole Executor of this my last will & Testament

 ever, I also give to y' aforesaid two children twenty five pounds to be divided be-

 Cook with all her future increase unto her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body
 for ever provided that if she or any such lawful heir do not come in within y space

 my daughter Ann Kingman to her & the heirs of her body lawfully for ever. It. I give
 unto aniseott fifty shillings for & towards the Cur of her dogg: — It. I give unto
 mary moors formerly mary Loosly five pounds — It. I give unto my two daught
 mary & Ann Kingman four years & half of dowles Savon yards & half of garris
 thro ornaments of Calico Savon yards of striped colored muslin as somant of
 striped houing & four silk handkerchiefs which is now in my house to be equally
 divided between them — It. I give unto my daughter Ann Kingman my plantation
 wherond I now live with all y lands & appurtenances therunto belonging & all the stock
 of cattle & hoggs & thor for the sum of negroes named as followeth Anne, Tom, & Jud & all
 her future increase y said land & negroes I give to my daughter Ann & the heirs of her
 body lawfully begotten for ever, & she to be possessed of all my estate as I have given
 her by this my will when she attains to y age of fifteen years, but if in case my
 said daughter should die without heirs aforesaid then I give all that I have
 given her by this my will that is to say my plantation & negroes for & towards the
 support & maintenance of a free school for the bringing up of poor or orphan children to
 education & good learning & that y said free school be kept upon my land & that said
 negroes too for the full support of a master to perform y duty as aforesaid and to no
 other use whatsoever, — It. I give unto Mr. Charles Sayer one horse called by the
 name of old buck one bridle & saddle to cap: Francis Land I give my young horse
 called buck one saddle & bridle to be delivered to them after my decease — It. I give
 unto my daughter Ann Kingman all the residue & remainder of my estate both
 real & personal not before disposed off by this my will after all my just debts are
 expences abated under same Limitations & Instructions as is before professed by
 this my will. & I do order & appoint that my said Daughter Ann &oline with
 Robert Bas two years & thet to be paid out of my estate for & towards her bringin
 of her up during y said time with a good & sufficient maintained and allowance
 for ydams, — And lastly I do make & ordain constitute & appoint Mr. Charles Sayer a
 cap: Francis Land to be my whole & sole Exec of this my last will & desir that this
