lot containing 100 Maudes acres whereon I now live to be sold at
publick sale to the highest Bidder for ready money & that to be equally Divide
between all my Children Item I give and bequeath to my Wife Mrs Anna &
Children all my Cows & Calves and my horse called George and the Star saddle and also four pairs of their
Horses and all my Sheep and all the Spinning Wheels belonging to me & also
one Spice morte and peper and two Dishes and three Boxes of Small plate
to her and her Heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath to my Son William
Whitchurst one hundred and fifty acres of Land adjoining one Arthur Whi-
tchurst & Lands given to him and his heirs forever Also Give to him my
New Gun to him and his heirs for ever Also give of Bequeath to my son
William Whitchurst One Negroe Girl called Kiny only my Wife to have the
use of her during her life and next to my Son William and his heirs for ever
Item The two Negroe Boys that comes in lesser to one and to my Son
Charles and the other to my Daughter Amy to them and their Heirs for ever
Item I give to my Wife Mary Whitchurst One feather Bed and furniture to
her and her heirs for ever Item I give to my Daughter Amy Whitchurst one
feather Bed and the furniture belonging to it to her and her heirs for ever Item I
leave all the remaining Part of my Rail Estate to be sold at publick sale for
ready money & I now appoint my Executors to pay any Debts out of the money
and the remaining part to be left put out upon Interest for the use of all my
Children as they come of Age and I now appoint both John Whitchurst and
Arthur Whitchurst my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament

late of Prince Anne County lately departed this life intestate without Issue
Sicnes and possessed of the following Estate of a Tract or parcel of Land con-
taining by Estimation One hundred and Eighty Acres with the Appurtenan
as Situate on the Eastern Shore in the County of Prince before whom
the said London lived and dyed and also of one other Tract or parcel of Land
containing by Estimation two hundred and fifty Acres situate in the
Eastern shore Swamp in the County aforesaid By whose Death the said tract
