I now Give to my Wife Mary Whitehurst One feather Bed and furniture to
her and her heirs for ever I now Give to my Daughter Amy Whitehurst one
feather Bed and the furniture belonging to it to her and her heirs for ever I now
have all the remaining Part of my Nail Estate to be sold at publick Sale for
ready money & I do appoint my Executors to pay out of the money
and the remaining part to be put out upon Interest for the use of all my
Children as they come of Age and I do appoint Capt John Whitehurst and
Arthur Whitehurst my Executors and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
