In the Name of God Amen That I Henrich Henley of the Parish of St. John  
 hauen and County of princeps anne being very sick & Weak & I Give and Bequeath  
 the to my son James Henley the plantation whereon I now live and all the Land  
 belonging to it and also the third part of a Island of Marsh called Great fresh  
 pond, upon the proviso he will agree to let his sister Rezia Moore have a small  
 Hedge of Land that lyes on the south side of the Meanner plantation and is divided  
 from the said plantation by a Low Stone or Wall that runneth Eastward by the  
 Peter Malbones Line for her life time. I say upon the proviso that he will let  
 his sister above mentioned live on the said Land all the days of her Natural  
 Life and let her quietly have hold Occupy possess and enjoy the said Hedge of  
 Land known by the Name of Dogwood Hedge as her own, during her Natural  
 Life without any hinderance or Molestation of him or his heirs or Assignes or  
 any other person or persons whatsoever by his Appointments or procurement  
 I say upon the proviso that he my said son James will let her my said Daugh-  
 ter Rezia Moore so have and enjoy the said Land as is above mentioned;  
 upon that proviso I give him my said son James the said Land and Marsh  
 above mentioned unto him and his heirs for ever and also two Negroes  
 named Cesar and Wood And a horse named Courage and my Gun and  
 sword & pistols and Holsters & a feather bed that I had when I was marri-  
 ed and the furniture belonging to it & a Oval Table and three head of Cattel  
 that is now called his provided he doe let his sister above mentioned  
 have the above said Land to him and his heirs for ever but if on any time  
 my said son James does Defaunt my Daughter Rezia of the above said  
 then my Will and Desire is that she my said Daughter Rezia Moore may  
 have the Marsh she and her heirs for ever that is the third part of the said  
 Island I give to her and her heirs & the feather bed and the oval Table which I  
 mentioned on the other side of this paper for my son James provided that  
 he will peaceably let her have the said Hedge of Land, but if he will not then  
 instead of the Land I give her the Marsh & Bed and oval Table above mentio-  
 ned to her and her heirs for ever. But if my son James does fulfill my Desire  
 in that particular then my Desire is that he may keep and quietly enjoy  
 all the particulars before mentioned he and his heirs for ever I give it to him for  
 his full part of all my Estate & Dove by this my last Will but him out from  
 claiming any more or coming in for any share of my Estate for ever  
 hereafter he or his heirs It I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rezia  
 Moore One Mary Sealed pisse and all her Increase and one pisse Hooper with  
 her Increase to her and her heirs for ever It I Give and bequeath to my Daugh-  
 ter Mary Henley one bredded Hissie with all her Increase and one half of a Mary  
 called Primus and half her Increase, to be given her when Lawfully Demanded  
 It I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Henley one Hissie that com-  
 eth

of a horse called <sup>the</sup> little horse with all her Increase and the other half of the above mentioned Mares of the one half of her Increase, I then give and bequeath the Use of all the remainder of my Estate To my well beloved Wife Novena Henley during her Natural Life, but it is only the Use that I give for whatsoever and at her day of Death my Will and Desire is that my Daughters Mary and Elizabeth Henley may have each of them a fourth Part and the furniture belonging to them and then my Will and Desire is that all the remainder of my Estate may be equally divided between my three Daughters Namely Anne, Mary Henley and Elizabeth Henley and their Heirs for ever and lastly I constitute and appoint my aforesaid Wife Novadennra Henley my Son in Law Gerson Moore my sole and whole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, revoking and annulling all other Wills and Testaments by me formerly made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 25<sup>th</sup> Day of Decem<sup>r</sup> 1752
