The Conditions of the above Obligation is such That if ever Sarah Moore Wife to Thomas Moore son of the above Robert Jones of any profit or proceeds thereunto belonging on a Plantation which the said Robert Jones bought of the said Th Moore being the same plantation which leap Henry Moore Devis'd to his son Thomas Moore in his last Will and Test now the said Thomas Moore or his heirs or for the security of such Mortgage or Interruption of the said Sarah Moore do make over Appear & convey all my right Title Interest Claim and Demand whatsoever the said Thomas Moore have in or unto the plantation whereon I now live at the request of the said Rob Jones during the Natural Life of the said Sarah Moore but no longer In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and year above Written my hand this 3rd Day of June The Moore
