In the Name of God Amen I David Scott of Prince George County being indisposed of
body but of sound & perfect memory for which I bless God to appoint this my last will
and testament in manner and form following: - I do I Commit my spirit to almighty
God who gave it to my body to let earth to be Doomly Interred: I order Direct that all my
just debts be paid: - Item 1: I give to my Son David Scott my plantation whereon I now
live after his mothers decease bearing him or his heirs of any provilleges in my plantation
further than shal be given to him & his heirs for ever: It. 2: I give to my two Sons
Richard & David Scott my plantation call Hugh Point to be equally divided betwixt them
to them & their heirs for ever: - It. 3: I give to my Son Richard Scott my plantation Call
Mathias to him & his heirs for ever: - It. 4: I give to my two Sons Richard & David my
tract of land lying near of north Landing to be Equally divided betwixt them to them &
their heirs for ever: It. 5: My will is that if either of my Sons Rich. or David Scott
die without issue that of above Land which I have given to them shall fall to my Son
Thomas Scott: - It. 6: I give to my Son Richard Scott my negro boy call Cato to be delivered
to him whom he comes to age of twenty one to him & his heirs for ever: It. 7: I give to my
daughter Frances my negro girl call Rosy all her in 20 years to be delivered at the day of
her marriage to her heirs for ever: It. 8: I give to my daughter Margaret my negro girl
call Honey all her in 20 years to be delivered at the day of her marriage to her heirs for
ever: It. 9: I give to my Son David Scott the two first child, or that or either of my
negro women call Amasa or illis to him & his heirs for ever: It. 10: I give to my Son Rich.
David & Thomas & my daughter Frances Margaret Mary & my child wt. ch my wife now god
with all & incrossed that shall come of my two negro women call Cato & Honey all
that I have given or if those about given should die before their children come to the
world I wish that they may come to good out of incrossed of you for no woman
and remainde off incrossed to be equally divided betwixt my two Sons and three
daughters & child which my wife now god with as aforsaid to come to their heirs
frise: It. 11: I give to my Son Rich. Scott my negro woman call Amasa after his mother
decease to him & his heirs for ever: It. 12: I give to my Son David Scott my negro woman
call Cato after his mother decease to him & his heirs for ever: - It. 13: I give to my three
children Richard David & the two daughters from Margaret Mary & my child which
my wife now god with the two others of three years old & three years to each child to be
delivered to them at the day of marriage or when they come to age: It. 14: I give to my Daughter
Frances one feather bed & furniture to be delivered her at the day of her marriage: It. 15:
I give to my Son John Scott three horses of three years old & three ewes to be delivered
to him when he comes to age in full of his portion: It. 16: I give to my loving wife all
my goods chattels & Estate Except what I have already given to her during her na-
tural life & after her decease to be equally divided betwixt all my children that
shall be living or I do appoint my Loving wife Faith Scott my Loving
brother Thomas Scott Exe of this my last will & Testament In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of January
in the year of our Lord 1727.

the Norfolk County November 15 Day 1691: John Whithurst being sick & weak
in body but sound of mind in memory do Ordain this my last will & Testament in
manner as followeth. I give to my two Sons John Whithurst & Hugh Whithurst in
part of lands lying at the three runs to be equally divided between them & their
heirs for ever: also I do give unto my Son Hugh a land that was formerly
