That is to say principally and first of all I give and
Recommend my Soul into the hands of God who
gave it and for my Body I commend it to the Earth
to be Buried in a Christian like decent manner at
the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God and as touching
such Worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God
to bless me in this life, I give Devise and Dispose of
the same in the following manner and Form.
I give and Bequeath unto Thomas Agnis my dear
beloved Friend the Sum of Fifty Pounds Current

calling to mind the mortality of my Body and

to make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament.
That is to say principally and first of all I give and
Recommend my Soul into the hands of God who
gave it and for my Body I commend it to the earth

for ever, Hagar, Hena, Charles, Providence, Luce
and Ben those and their increase forever by him
freely to be possessed and enjoyed lying in the hands

on care of John Lovett my Guardian, Thomas Agnew
 whom I likewise constitute make and Order
 my only and sole Executor of this my last Will
 and Testament I do hereby utter publish and all
 and every other former Testaments, Wills Legacies
 Bequests and Executors by me in any ways
 before this time named Willed and Bequeathed
 ratifying and confirming this and no other
 to my last Will and Testament. Witnes whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day
 and Year above Written.

The Court held for Prince Anne County Dec. 14th 1780

dec^d was proved according to Law by the Oath of Bagnwell
Moore who Deposed that he saw Saunders M. Gabe
dec^d Subscribe his name as a Witness to the same and
is Ordered to be Recorded, Thomas Pignie the Executor
therein named having departed this life Intestate
Therefore On the Motion of Elizabeth Tenant who
made Oath and gave Bond with Security as the Law
directs, Certified he is granted her for obtaining
Letters of Administration with the Will annexed
on the Estate of the said John Giles Trotter in due Form

in the Year of Our Lord Christ One Thousand Seven
Hundred and Eighty Between William Hill and
Amy his Wife of the County of Prince Anne in
Virginia of the one part and Thomas Lewis of the
same place of the other part, Witnesseth that for
and in consideration of the Sum of Two Hundred
Pounds Current Money of Virginia to the said William
Hill and Amy his Wife in Hand paid by the said
Thomas Lewis a Tor before the Sealing and Delivery
of these Presents the Receipt whereof they do hereby
Acknowledge They the said William Hill and Amy
his Wife Have Granted Bargained Sold and Con-
firmed and by these Presents they do Grant
Bargain Sell and Confirm unto the said Thomas
Lewis and his Heirs a certain Tract or parcel of Land
containing Three Acres be the same more or less lying and
being in the said County of Prince Anne before said in
the Sea Side Neck near the Sand Bridge and adjoining
the other Land of the said Thomas Lewis and is part
of the

the said side Neck man the Sand Bridge and is joining
the other Land of the said Thomas Lewis and is part
of the Plantation whereon he the said William Hill
doth now live and is Bounded as followeth, to wit,
Beginning at a White Oak standing near the
Main Road and thence running order West to a pine
Sapling and thence a certain bore or till it intercepts
the other Land of the said Thomas Lewis and thence
binding on the said Lewis's Land & until it inter-
cepts the first Station, And all Houses, Buildings
Orchards, Ways, Waters, Water Courses, Profits and
appurtenances whatsoever to the said Premises
belonging or in anywise appertaining of the
Rivers and Derivations Remained & Remains
Rents Issues and Profits thereof and all the Estate
Right and Title of them the said William Hill and
Army his Wife or her and to their heirs to have and
to hold all and singular the Premises hereby Barga-
ined and Sold with the appurtenances unto the
said Thomas Lewis his heirs and assigns against

him the said William Hill and his Heirs & all and every
other Person and Persons whatsoever shall and will Warrant
and for ever defend by these Presents, In Witnes whereof the
said William Hill and Amy his Wife have hereunto set
their Hands and Affixed their Seals the day and year
first above mentioned.
