presentes doth grant release enfeoffed and confirm unto
the said Thomas his heirs and assigns for ever One
certain parcel of Land situate near Kempres Landing
beginning in the middle of a Marsh between

beginning in the middle of a Marsh between
said Land and the tract and plantation of Land belo-
nging to Mr Charles Sayer and wherein the said Sayer
now lives and along the Meanders of said Marsh to the
beginning of a branch that makes from said marsh up
and along by the old House tho' said James Kempe form-
erly lived, thence along the meanders of said branch to a
corner stone on the North side said branch, thence
soothe one and half Degrees West three hundred
and fifty three feet to a corner stone of Mr Whites
Land, thence along the said Whites line, to his corner
stone on the main street, thence along the said
street, to the corner stone of Col. Walkers along the
said Walkers line to the corner stone of George
Wishart etc. & thence along the said Wisharts line

to the Corner stone of John Smith's, thence along
the said Smith's line to the Corner Stone of James
Carraway thence along the said Carraway's line
to the main street, that leads from the Eastern shore
to Kempt's Landing, thence along the said Road
till it intersects Mr. Walker's line, thence along the
said Walker's line south twenty eight and a half
Degrees West four hundred and sixty feet, to a
Sycamore stump, thence along the said Walker's
line across a field or pasture, down to the Meanders
of a branch, which joins the said river, thence
along the Meander said branch to the first station
To have and to hold the said Land with its
appurtenances unto him the said Thomas his heirs and
assigns for ever to the city proper use and school of him
the said Thomas his heirs and assigns for ever, and the
said James doth covenant and grant to and with the

Assigns shall and may from time to time and at all

all and every person or persons whatsoever, & will
himself whence the said James rempe hath here
unto set his hand and seal the day and year
first above written.

Simple of and in the Premises hereby bargained and
sold and that they have good power and ^{right} and
absolute Authority to grant and convey the same to the
said William White in manner and form aforesaid and
that the said Premises now are and so for ever hereafter
shall remain and be free and clear of and from all former
and other gifts, Grants, Bargains, Sales, Power Right
and Title of Lawyer, Attorneyes, Executors, Testes, Troubles
Charges and Encumbrances whatsoever made done committ-
ed or suffered by the said Thomas Kempe and also his
