Plantations and Lands and all my whole
Estate within and without to be sold at Pub
lick Sale & the Money to be Equally divided
between my Brother Jonathan Williamson
and Sister Franky Siggatt, and Whereas I
have several debts due me from several
Persons & my Will and desires that my Executor

hereinafter named collect the same and
 apply them to discharge my just Debts
 and lastly I do hereby appoint my loving
 Brother Jonathan Williamson to be my
 whole and sole Executor of this my last
 Will and Testament, In Witness whereof
 I do hereof set my hand and Seal this 16th
 Day of March 1700
