the said James Whithurst and Elizabeth his wife have granted  
bargained sold alienated and confirmed unto his executors  
do grants bargain sell, alien and confirm unto the said  
James Whithurst and his Heirs, one certain tract or parcel  
of Land situate lying and being in the County aforesaid  
containing forty-six Acres and three Quarters of an Acre  
and bounded as follows, beginning at a stone stump and

their Heirs all and singular the Promises hereby bargained  
and sold only reserving the Flower of the said Amy Whitehurst  
unto the said James Whitehurst his Heire and Assigns  
against them the said Peter Whitehurst and Elizabeth his wife  
and all and every other Person and Persons whatsoever shall  
and will warrant and for ever defend by these Presents.
