This Indenture made the Twenty ninth day of November
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
sixty two between Benjamin Branch of the County of Prince
George one part and Smith Shepherd Esq. of the County
of the other part witnesseth That for and in consideration of
the sum of Thirty four Pounds current Money of Virginia
to him the said Benjamin Branch in Hand paid by the
D Smith Shepherd at or before the sealing and delivery
of these presents the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge
full granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth
grant to begin and set unto the D Smith Shepherd his
Custos Administrators or assigns all the Right Title and
Interest which the D Benjamin Branch hath in and to the
one third part of all that plantation or part of lands called
and known by the name of Greenfield and which came to the
possession of the D Benjamin Branch by Intermarrying with Mary
Wife of the late Henry Alleged late of the County who
died and dying of the aforesaid Plantation in parading his
right as the son of Mr D. H. Husband Lands to have and
to hold the one third Part of the Plantation aforesaid together
with the Buildings and other improvements thereon erected
to him the D Smith Shepherd his Custos Administrators or
assigns for and during the term of the natural life of the D.
Branch and the D Benjamin Branch for and against himself
and against every other Person or persons whatsoever the D
Smith Shepherd his Custos Administrators or assigns the aforesaid
Plantation shall and will warrant and defend for and during
the aforesaid term by these presents Ben: Branch,
