

Wishart to Valentine

This Indenture made the thirtieth Day of August, one thousand seven hundred and Eighty five. Between Thomas Wishart Attorney at Law and Porcia his wife of the town of Suffolk and county of Nansemond of the one part, and Jacob Valentine Gent of the town of Kempis Ville and County of Princess Anne of the other part Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds current money of Virginia in hand paid by the said Jacob Valentine the receipt whereof they the said Thomas Wishart and Porcia his wife do hereby acknowledge the said Thomas Wishart and Porcia his wife have granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed, and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said Jacob Valentine and his Heirs for ever, one piece or lot of ground or Land, lying, being or situate in the town of Kempis Ville aforesaid and bounded as follows to wit, beginning at a stone a Corner of Christopher Brugh's lot, and running N^o 30 degrees West five hundred thirty four and a half feet along the said Brugh's and John Tipting lot to a corner stone by the road side that leads to the Easternshore turne South 47 D^og W^o sixty feet to a stone, thence S. 52 1/2 E about five hundred feet to a stone on m^t. Matthia's line, thence N^o 76 D^og fifty feet to the first Station, and in the same land which the said Thomas Wishart purchased of William Gads as will more full and at large appear by a deed of bargain and sale bearing date the twentieth day of February one thousand seven hundred and eighty five together with all Houses, waps, profits hereditaments and Appurtenances whatsoever. To have and to hold the said Land being a half Acre and a quarter of an Acre more or less, and all and singular the hereby bargained Premises unto him the said Jacob Valentine and his Heirs and Assigns, to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Jacob Valentine his Heirs and Assigns for ever. And the said Thomas Wishart and Porcia his wife for themselves their Heirs, Executors and Administrators the said Land, and all and singular the said bargained Premises unto the said Jacob Valentine and his heirs Executors and Administrators warrants and will for ever defend by these presents. Third Indenture made the 28th Day of November in the Year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and Eighty five Between Jacob Valentine and Fanny his wife of the County of Princess Anne and common wealth of Virginia of the one part, and William Black of the County and Common wealth aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Jacob Valentine and Fanny his wife for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred pounds specie to them in hand paid by the said William Black at or before the sealing and Delivery of these Presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and therefore doth release acquit and discharge the said William Black his Heirs, Executors and Administrators, hath granted bargained sold aliened released and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said William Black his Heirs and Assigns for ever, one certain tract or parcel of Land containing by a late survey, / reference being had to the plat of the same two hundred Acres be the same more or less / to wit, beginning at a corner post standing near a large white Oak, standing in Peter Whitehurst's line and running Southwardly 29 poles to a dead pine stump, thence S. 56 D. W. 29 poles to the North Landing Road, thence S. 8. 60 poles to a corner beech, thence binding on H. Cade's Land, to a Stake in Matthia's line to a marked Corner sweet Gum, thence binding on the said Matthia's line several courses to a corner post of Touching's line, thence on the said Touching's line to a corner sweet Gum, thence West 265 poles to the first Station. To have and to hold the said bargained premises unto the said William Black and his Heirs and Assigns for ever. to the only proper use and behoof of him the said William
