

This Indenture made the sixteenth
Day of December in the Year of our Lord, One
Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety seven.
Between Peter Bacon and Elizabeth his wife of
the County of Prince George in the Commonwealth
of Virginia of the one Part, and Nathaniel Stogard
of the County of Prince Anne and Commonwealth
aforesaid of the other Part. Witnesseth, that the said
Peter Bacon and Elizabeth his wife for and in Con-
sideration of the sum of Six Hundred Pounds current
Money of the Commonwealth aforesaid, to them in hand
paid by the said Nathaniel Stogard, at or before the
sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bar-
gained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, and confirmed,
and by these presents do grant, bargain sell, alien,
enfess, and confirm, unto the said Nathaniel Stog-
ard his Heirs and Assigns for ever, a certain tract
or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the
Parish of Lynnhaven and the aforesaid County of Prince
Anne, adjoining the Land which the said Nathaniel
Stogard formerly bought of the said Peter Bacon and
bounded as follows; to wit, beginning at a white Oak at
the Head of a branch in the line of the said Nathaniel
Stogard, and running thence North eighty seven de-
grees East, one hundred and forty pole to a Sycamore on
Edward St. Moseley's line, thence along the same North
ten degrees West ninety nine pole to a Sycamore a corner
tree, thence South eighty five degrees West, one hundred
and ninety five pole to a red Oak near the head of a
branch, thence South sixty six degrees West, sixty eight pole
to a Sycamore near the head of another branch, thence run-
ning on the Branch agreeable to the Meanders thereof to
