### The Commonwealth of Virginia.

To William Durrell and Daniel Shadorn Gentlemen Greeting  
Whereas Peter Bacon and Elizabeth his Wife, by their  
certain Indenture of Bargain and Sale bearing date the  
16<sup>th</sup> day of December 1791, have sold and conveyed unto  
Nathaniel Stogard a certain piece or parcel of Land  
lying and being in the County of Prince Anne containing  
Two Hundred and six Acres, And Whereas the said  
Elizabeth cannot conveniently travel to our Court of our County  
of Prince Anne to make acknowledgment of the said conveyance  
therefore We do give unto you, or any two or more of you,  
power to receive the acknowledgment which the said Elizabeth
